

Eagle Crest recognized as School of Excellence

Eagle Crest Charter Academy was recently awarded the School of Excellence designation by the Central Michigan University Board of Trustees.

To celebrate this achievement, the school is hosting a special event at 1:30 p.m. Sept. 9.

Representatives from CMU will hand out T-shirts to congratulate students on their success.

To be designated as a School of Excellence, kindergarten through eighth grade schools must demonstrate either a three-year average proficiency of 70 percent on the state assessment in reading and math while serving at least 50 percent free/reduced-price lunch eligible students or, as is the case with Eagle Crest, a three-year average proficiency of 90 percent on the state assessment in reading and math.

Eagle Crest achieved 96 percent and 95 percent proficiency in reading and math.
