## Things to bring each day

- $\Diamond$  Backpack labeled with students name and large enough to put an 8 1/2  $\times$  11 inch plastic folder, lunch box, water bottle, art work, library book
- Morning and afternoon healthy snacks labeled snack 1 and snack 2, placed in cubby separate from lunch box
- ♦ Lunch (if not purchasing school lunch) lunch box labeled with students name
  - For the first week of school, please send peanut-free items until we can confirm allergies.
  - You should have received information on how to prepay for hot lunches and milk in an email from the office. If you need more information please contact the front office. Hot lunch will be served on the first day of school.
- Water Bottle labeled with students name

## Things to bring during the first week

- ♦ Change of clothes—to be left at school in case of spills or accidents, in a Zip-loc bag with your students name on it (underwear, socks, shirt, pants all labeled)
- ♦ 1 oversized shirt (no buttons) to be used as an Art Shirt (Zip-loc bag and shirt labeled)
- $\Diamond$  Rest Bag Reusable shopping bag with a small blanket and mini pillow/cuddly friend inside all labeled
- ♦ 1 two pocket **plastic** folder (five star first gear) labeled with name on front (No cardboard folders please)
- $\Diamond$  2 or more boxes of Crayola brand washable crayons, NOT the jumbo size
- ♦ 16 Elmer purple glue sticks (yes, we truly use this many)
- ♦ 1 box of tissue (any brand)
- ♦ 4 or more containers of Clorox brand wipes (Must be Clorox brand)
- ♦ 1 package of 4 or more Expo brand dry erase markers (or Crayola Washable Dry Erase)
- ♦ 1 package of Crayola Pip-Squeak Markers (The short half-sized markers)
