Summary: Corrective Reading is designed to promote reading accuracy (decoding), fluency, and comprehension skills of students in grade 3 or higher who are reading below their grade level. The program has four levels that correspond to students' decoding skills. All lessons in the program are sequenced and scripted. Corrective Reading can be implemented in small groups of 4-5 students or in a whole-class format. Corrective Reading is intended to be taught in 45-minute lessons 4-5 times a week.

The 10 Practices are: 1) Deliberate, research-informed efforts to foster literacymotivation and engagement within and across lessons 2) Read alouds of age-appropriate books and othermaterials, print or digital 3) Small group and individual instruction, using a variety of groupingstrategies, most often with flexible groups formed and instructiontargeted to children's observed and assessed needs in specificaspects of literacy development 4) Activities that build phonological awareness (grades K and 1 and as needed thereafter) 5)Explicit instruction in letter-sound relationships 6) Research- and standards-aligned writing instruction 7) Intentional and ambitious efforts to build vocabulary andcontent knowledge 8) Abundant reading material and reading opportunities in the classroom 9) Ongoing observation and assessment of children'slanguage and literacy development that informs theireducation 10) Collaboration with families in promoting literacy
