Subject: Fiscal year 2026 Section 31a Annual Transparency Report

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The primary focus of Section 31a of the Michigan State School Aid Act provides funding to ensure that pre-Kindergarten-12<sup>th</sup> grade *at-risk eligible students* demonstrate proficiency in:


- 3<sup>rd</sup> grade English Language Arts
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade Mathematics
- College and Career Readiness by High School Graduation
- Regular Student Attendance

An *at-risk student* is any K-12 student that meets one or more of the identification criteria outlined in the Section 31a legislation.

In compliance with [MCL-Section 388.1631a \(17\) of the State School Aid Act](#), beginning in the 2025-2026 school year and every year thereafter, each district who receives Section 31a funds must provide a notification to parents/guardians that includes the amount of funding received under the grant, how the district distributed those funds, and what evidence-based interventions were implemented with those grant dollars.

During the 2025-2026 school year, Metro Charter Academy received Section 31a funds from the state of Michigan. This letter serves as notification of the transparency reporting requirements under the law.

    - Metro Charter Academy is a single-building district, and therefore all Section 31a funds received are allocated to Metro Charter Academy.

    2. Spring Continuous School Improvement Stakeholder meetings
